Need to review the race instructions. The course with a downwind finish involved a hook finish around the gate to a tight reach/beat to a separate finish boat. This led to a number of incidents at the gate mark and in some cases mistaken identity of finish line to start line. This could have been avoided with a finish line set downwind of the leeward gate allowing kites to be flown through the finish.

The primary issue was the forced gybe drop for boats approaching with rights on starboard at the gate. In breeze this led to unnecessary issues and condensing of the fleet. The class will ensure we revert to a finish line below the leeward gate for future championships.
