	(2) Generally in terms class logistic of running a World Championship? (not venue specific points)
	Competitors need to be urged to protest against rule infringements. Sailors don't protest because a) it's a hassle, creates bad feeling and spoils a good evening and b) the perception is that most protests are thrown out by juries on a technicality – it saves them hearing it.
	Jury needs to be more proactive e.g. rules about coach boats not encroaching on course were flouted. These have been tightened up for 2016 but without enforcement are useless. Ditto on use of electronic instrumentation (GPS)
