

## F.1.7 Q&A 2015-001

## Question

Are stays attached to a pin above the measurement band and passing thorough the mast spar below the measurement band, as in the drawing, backstays?



## **Answer**

**Rigging points** are defined in ERS F.2.3, and F.2.3(d) applies in this case:

- F.2.3(d) RIGGING POINT The intersection of the outside of the **spar**, extended as necessary, and the centreline of the **rigging**.
- F.1.7(b)(ii) BACKSTAY

**Rigging** mainly used to provide aft support for a mast **spar** above the **upper limit mark**.

F.1.7(b)(iii) RUNNING BACKSTAY

**Rigging** used to provide aft support for a mast **spar** at a point, or points, between the **upper limit mark** and the **forestay rigging point**.

**Rigging** attached to a pin and passing through the mast **spar** below the **upper limit mark**, as in the drawing above, are **running backstays** as defined in F.1.7(b)(iii).

Terms in bold style used as defined in the ERS.
