	(a) ASHORE: Boats were all able to be docked in front of the club, which was convenient. Housing was within walking distance, both hotels and private

homes for rent. The clubhouse was a good size and had well attended social functions. We were able to use the club and a local sail loft for sail measurement. The local boatyard was a bit further away, but we were able to use a powerboat as a staging area for boat inspections and offloading gear for boat weighing.

(b) AFLOAT: Racing was excellent, although a long trek to the race course. There was no real option to race inside the harbour if it was too rough outside because of all the commercial traffic.
