(a) ASHORE: Boats were docked in front of the club which was convenient. The clubhouse was new and included an excellent restaurant. The building was not large enough to handle 500 sailors for post racing. The club erected a large tent overlooking the harbour which was used for after race socializing and sail measurement. Due to a wet spring and summer, construction and landscaping in much of the surrounding area was still under way and behind schedule, so it was quite muddy. There was no little to no available housing within walking distance, most was several miles away.

(b) AFLOAT: The racecourse was only a short motor away for the harbour. Race committee work was excellent.
