The following Changes have been approved to be effective on the 20 November 2012.

Current Rule:

A.4 ADMINISTRATION OF THE CLASS

- A.4.1 ISAF has delegated the administrative functions of the class to MNA's. The MNA may delegate part or all of its functions, as stated in these **class rules** to an NCA
- A.4.2 In countries where there is no MNA, or the MNA does not wish to administrate the class, its administrative functions as stated in these **class rules** shall be carried out by the IFCA which may delegate the administration to an NCA

Amended Rules:

A.4 ADMINISTRATION OF THE CLASS

- A.4.1 ISAF has delegated the administrative functions of the class to the IFCA. The IFCA may delegate part or all of its functions, as stated in these class rules to an NCA
- A.4.2 In countries where there is no MNA, or the MNA does not wish to administrate the class, its administrative functions as stated in these class rules shall be carried out by the IFCA which may delegate the administration to an NCA

Current Rule:

A.6.1 At Class Events – see RRS 89.1.d) – ISAF Regulation 26.5(f) applies. At all other events RRS 86 applies.

Amended Rule:

A.6.1 At Class Events – see RRS 89.1.d) – ISAF Regulation 10.5(f) applies. At all other events RRS 87 applies.

C.3 PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

C.3.1 FLOTATION DEVICES

In alteration to RRS 1.2 a buoyancy vest or jacket is optional but may be described as mandatory in the Sailing Instructions. If personal buoyancy is prescribed, every competitor shall wear a personal flotation device that shall conform to the minimum standard ISO 12402-5 (Level 50). Alternative or additional standards may be prescribed in the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions

Amended Rule:

C.3 PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

C.3.1 SAFETY AND LIFE-SAVING EQUIPMENT

In alteration to RRS 1.2 the following provision is made: Competitors are not obliged to carry personal life saving equipment (flotation devices) on board unless RRS40 applies, in which case the personal flotation devices shall be worn. If used, the personal flotation device shall conform to the minimum standards of ISO 12402-5. Alternative or additional standards may be prescribed in the Notice of Race.
