Great support from town and council.

	 There is no club, it is run as a remote sailing centre with staff and personnel brought in for each event. The Polish class association had to do most of the onshore organisation. AFLOAT: Situated at the head of a bay, the wind is offshore from every direction but S. This makes conditions very shifty and largely unpredictable. Many races were marked by 50-60 degree shifts, inadequate race management with some questionable decisions on abandoning or letting races run, for example when huge changes in the wind upset the order or left the fleet becalmed for 15 minutes.
