 - Positive Feedbacks:
- Simply fantastic event, well planned and thought out. Great delivery.
- Great social event
- Standard of the fleet was very high, event was truly international with a good spread of nations. One of the best Worlds ever.
- Rankings for Master's and Women's was a positive addition to the event. In the future, the qualification for these rankings need to be set by the class and published in advance. The two rankings will be called the Master's Fleet Champion and Women's Fleet Champion.
- The single start line was a success and should be carried forwards for future large championships.
- (6) VENUE GOOD & BAD POINTS?
 - Negative feedbacks:
- Buddy system for safety checks were not taken seriously. There was a total lack of spot checking. Measurement seemed to be lacking for a serious World Championship.
- Some confusion over the daily pasta party location.

- Would have preferred a sit down dinner at some stage of the Championship.
- There was a lack of spares available from the local dealer. In the future, Sportsboat World will ensure that a minimum level is in stock and if not, they will supply themselves.
- The admin mix up over ISAF numbers caused some anxiety that was not necessary, this is very normal for French sailors to provide these numbers, but should not have been part of the wider registration.
- Changes with the Mayor and the town of Hyeres meant the main reception room could only be used for the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, this caused issues crews not knowing where to find the pasta on a daily basis.
- The SI's was interpreted by Trevor Lewis as restricting ALL contact between a coach boat and a competitor during a Championship. This applied to all coaches who registered and paid the €60 fee to be in the race area. It was agreed that in the future, coaches would be allowed to communicate with a crew between races but the transfer of equipment (food, drink, spares, sails, repair equipment or tools) will not be permitted. NOTE: It is not within the class ethos to encourages crews to have coaches on the water at a World Championship.
