The regatta was essentially thoroughly in place as far as logistic planning and sponsorship 1 year ahead of time.</p> <p><b>(6) VENUE GOOD &amp; BAD POINTS?</b> The venue is an exceptional sailing area. Large waves with 3' chop and 12-25kts daily from the east.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <b>ASHORE:</b> The hotel fit the Sunfish Classes needs perfectly.</li> <li>- <b>AFLOAT:</b> The only negative is that when the wind shifts occasionally 10-15 degrees this creates a very unusual sea condition that is very challenging to ride waves and straight into the waves up wind on port.
