Workum Sailing Club has excellent race management facilities and were able to provide everything that the competitors and their families required.

VENUE GOOD & BAD POINTS?

ASHORE:

Although there is no real fixed base for the sailing club apart from two permanent portacabins for offices, the Club was able to provide additional temporary facilities (Toilets, marquee and additional offices) plus the campsite immediately adjacent to the competition area with restaurant and other facilities. The town of Workum was a short cycle ride away and had everything that the competitors and their families required. Having everyone so close enhanced the family feeling of the event

- AFLOAT:

Excellent sailing water with a fairly consistent wind and managed by an superb race management team on well equipped committee boats.

The beach launching required competitors to wade some distance before they could sail properly with their dagger board down, but this did not prove to be a problem and the sailors found it useful when returning to shore.
