The club provided excellent facilities and race management although timekeeping and timely responses were not the best.

(6) VENUE GOOD & BAD POINTS?

ASHORE:

The facilities ashore although basic were augmented by marquees and outdoor facilities making the overall impression very good. The sailing club was immediately adjacent to camping sites which made the whole event compact and friendly. The local town were very supportive and the parents appeared to thoroughly enjoy the town and beach.

- AFLOAT:

The sailing area was approximately 1 km off shore and visible from the beach and sailing club. The waters were not severely affected by currents and the winds favourable. The down side of the event was the height of the tide which sometimes restricted launching and recovery.

(1) At the same venue

An excellent facility with great sailing, ideal for events of similar size and family orientated, although senior classes would also find the club welcoming and racing interesting.

(2) Generally in terms class logistic of running a World Championship? (not venue specific points)

It is essential that the venue is such that we can attract more international competitors. As a youth and junior fleet it is important that we hold the event when they are not in school and provide addition incentives to get sailors from other continents.
