Please give a short report of the World Championship(s) & send a copy of the final overall results.	1) ORGANISATION QUALITY?
	The measurement procedures were less than normal, mainly because of limited harbour areas. Last year our class rules were completely rewritten in accordance with the ERM rules and the ISAF standard class rules. Because of uncertainty about the new rules and the fact that several amendments were issued very late the preparations suffered.

The Yngling class has been lacking qualified measurers in several countries. The Swiss Yngling Association never had any measurer connected to our Technical Committee.

2) VENUE GOOD & BAD POINTS?

ASHORE: The regatta office functioned very well. The Jury room was located in a nearby hotel with excellent services. In a nearby park a party tent had been set up with excellent services to the sailors. The harbour areas had been expanded by the military building temporary berths and moorings to allow the large number of boats. The voluntary people running the regatta were nice and knew their jobs.

AFLOAT: According to the local people the wind conditions were very different from normal. Most of the time there were heavy clouds and little wind. Normally the sun should be shining and fairly good thermal winds should arrive around noon every day. This was the summer when there were devestating floods all over Europe.

Please state any recommendations for future World Championship events Brunnen is a nice place for regattas. If the winds are normal there should be possibilities for good racing conditions.
