1. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

(a) Minutes

2. COACHES AND ISAF

The Committee considered submission 017-04 (other Committee) from the Russian Yachting Federation about forming a Coaches Subcommittee of the Events Committee and made a recommendation to Council.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 017-04 from the Russian Yachting Federation about forming a Coaches Subcommittee of the Events Committee. However the Committee endorsed the principle of having the coaches incorporated in the ISAF structure. The Events Committee recommends referring the issue to the Executive Committee.

Vote: 19 in favour, 1 abstention

3. COMPETITION FORMAT 2008 OLYMPIC REGATTA

(a) Working Party Report

The Committee received a report from the Events Committee Format Working Party. The working party consists of Kim Andersen (chair), Julian Bethwaite, TP Low, Axel Guepner and Björn Unger. The Chairman of the Working Party reported that it had received a lot of feedback especially from the media point of view. There is a lot of criticism about the way we run our competitions. Format changes are important to promote the sport and increase participation. The Working Party presented a time schedule for its work that was approved and is attached to these minutes as attachment 1. Questions were raised about funding for this programme.

(b) Deferred submission 040-03

The Committee reconsidered submission 040-03 from the Danish Sailing Association about the format of future Olympic Regattas and to made a recommendation to Council. It was felt that although the ideas in the submission may be good, it is better to 'clear the deck' and reject the submission and make new proposals.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 040-03 from the Danish Sailing Association about the format of future Olympic Regattas. The Events Committee requests the Format Working Party to draft new proposals.

(c) Submission 047-04

The Committee considered submission 047-04 from the Royal Netherlands Yachting Union about the competition format (inclusion of match racing) of the Olympic Sailing Regatta and made a recommendation to Council. The Committee fully supported the idea of experiments The discussion mainly revolved around the issue whether this should be at grade 1 events, or not. It was argued it should be at a high level as this is the level at which you can really test. On the other hand it was felt not to interfere with the format of the high level events as these are too important for the sailors to allow experiments.

The Committee did not reconsider submission 048-03 from the Chairman of the Regional Games Committee about the selection of events and equipment for the 2008 Olympic as this was already been dealt with by Council in June 2004

5. SELECTION OF EQUIPMENT FOR THE 2008 OLYMPIC REGATTA

The Committee rejected submission 054-04 (other Committee) from Swiss Sailing about the selection of Windsurfing equipment for the 2008 Olympic Regatta in favour of their decision under item 5(g).

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 054-04 from Swiss Sailing about the selection of Windsurfing equipment for the 2008 Olympic Regatta.

(d) Submission 055-04

9. OTHER SUBMISSIONS DEFERRED BY COUNCIL IN NOVEMBER 2003 AND NOT DEALT WITH IN JUNE 2004

(a) Deferred submission 051-03

The Committee reconsider submission 051-03 from the International Yngling Class about events of the class to be 'open' (men and women) and made a recommendation to Council (see also Events Committee November 2003 meeting minutes item 11). The Committee felt that Graded event Organisers have the right to invite 'women only fleets', as this is the Olympic discipline. The Class however can do what they want for Class Events and sail in mixed fleets if they so wish.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 051-03 from the International Yngling Class about events of the class to be 'open'.

Vote: 16 in favour of rejecting the submission, 2 against, 1 abstention

(b) Deferred submission 060-03

The Committee noted Council meeting November 2003 minute on submission 060-03 from the Chairman of the Events Committee about downgrading events when standards of high quality race management are not maintained. After some discussion, the Events Committee confirmed its earlier decision regarding this submission.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee confirms its previous position recommending to Council rejecting submission 060-03 from the Chairman of the Events Committee about downgrading events when standards of high quality race management are not maintained.

Vote: 17 in favour of rejecting, 1 against, 1 abstention

10. ISAF ELIGIBILITY CODE

The Committee considered submission 069-04 from the Royal Yachting Association about ISAF regulation 19.4.1 and made a recommendation to Council.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council accepting submission 069-04 from the Royal Yachting Association about ISAF regulation 19.4.1.

Vote: unanimous

11. ISAF EVENTS

(a) 2006 ISAF World Sailing Games

The Committee received a progress report. The Organising Committee has been set up and the event contract with ISAF has been signed.

(b) 2007 ISAF World Championships

The Committee received a progress report. The venue decided by the Executive Committee is Cascais, Portugal. A memorandum of understanding has been signed and a draft contract has been drawn up. The Committee noted that the proposed dates (second half of July 2007) would mean a clash with both the ISAF Youth World Championship and the Pan Am Games. The Committee felt that such a clash should be avoided.

(c) Submission 059-04

The Committee considered submission 059-04 from the Fédération Française de Voile about staging two ISAF World Championships (for the Olympic Classes) and made a recommendation to Council.

Page 8 of 14 Last updated: 20-Dec-04

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 059-04 from the Fédération Française de Voile about staging two ISAF World Championships (for the Olympic Classes). The Committee expressed it's sympathy for the proposal but does not support this for implementation before 2008.

(d) Submission 060-04

The Committee considered submission 060-04 from the Chairman of the Events Committee about a new regulation regarding ISAF Events and made a recommendation to Council. This submission was the result of the work by the ISAF Events Working Party. Some members of the Committee expressed concerns about the fixing of the dates. The Committee agreed that some flexibility needs to be built in.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council approving submission 060-04 from the Chairman of the Events Committee about a new regulation regarding ISAF Events with the following amendments:

- Include in 17.2.6; 'these dates may be changed by the Executive Committee when necessary'.
- Include in 17.3.5; these dates may be changed by the Executive Committee when necessary'.
- Delete in 17.3.6; 'or continental'.

Vote: 12 in favour, 5 against, 2 abstentions

(e) Submission 028-04

The Committee considered submission 028-04 from the ORC about recognition of the ORC as the organising authority of the Offshore Team Racing World Championship and made a recommendation to Council.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 028-04 from the ORC about recognition of the ORC as the organising authority of the Offshore Team Racing World Championship. The Events Committee supports the Executive Committees views on this issue.

Vote: 19 in favour of rejecting, 1 abstention

12. ISAF CALENDAR OF EVENTS

(a) Submission 063-04

The Committee considered submission 063-04 from the Fédération Française de Voile about the time between events and made a recommendation to Council. It was felt that it would be helpful if the dates of premium events would be entered into the online calendar more than one year ahead.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee supports submission 063-04 from the Fédération Française de Voile about calendar protection for ISAF grade 1 events. Refer this to an Events Committee working party for a proposal to the Mid Year Meeting of the Committee.

The Committee considered submission 064-04 from the Royal Netherlands Yachting Union about date protection for ISAF grade 1 events and made a recommendation to Council.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 064-04 from the Royal Netherlands Yachting Union about date protection for ISAF grade 1 events. The Events Committee however supports part A of the submission in principle and refers this to an Events Committee working party for a proposal to the Mid Year Meeting of the Committee.

13. ISAF RANKINGS

(a) <u>Deferred submission 062-03</u>

The Committee reconsidered submission 062-03 from US Sailing about the method of calculation of the ISAF Sailing World Rankings and received a recommendation from the Rankings Subcommittee.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council accepting submission 062-03 from US Sailing about the method of calculation of the ISAF Sailing World Rankings as amended by the Ranking Subcommittee:

- -The quality factor for World and Continental Championship events should always be 1.5.
- No other changes shall be made to the method of calculation.
- The method of calculation shall be incorporated in ISAF Regulation 24.1.

Vote: Unanimous

(b) Submission 067-04

The Committee considered submission 067-04 (other committee) from the Swedish Sailing Federation about XML exchange format for exchanging events results data for the ISAF rankings software and received a recommendation from the Rankings Subcommittee.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee supports submission 067-04 from the Swedish Sailing Federation about XML exchange format for exchanging events results data for the ISAF rankings software.

Vote: Unanimous

(c) Submission 070-04

The Committee considered submission 070-04 from the Deutscher Segler Verband about protocol reports for the events counting for the ISAF World Rankings and received a recommendation from the Rankings Subcommittee.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 070-04 from the Deutscher Segler Verband about protocol reports for the events counting for the ISAF World Rankings.

Vote: 16 in favour of rejecting, 0 against, 3 abstentions

(d) Submission 071-04

To consider submission 071-04 from the Deutscher Segler Verband about results for the events counting for the ISAF World Rankings and received a recommendation from the Rankings Subcommittee. It was felt that the real reason for the submission is to legislate for the principle that one has to be a member of the relevant class to be listed in the Rankings for that class. The proposed method in the submission may be to bureaucratic.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council deferring submission 071-04 from the Deutscher Segler Verband about results for the events counting for the ISAF World Rankings.

Vote: 16 in favour, 0 against, 3 abstentions

(e) Submission 071A-04

The Committee considered submission 071A-04 from the Royal Netherlands Yachting Union about format for ISAF graded events and received a recommendation from the Rankings Subcommittee.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council deferring submission 071A-04 from the Royal Netherlands Yachting Union about format for ISAF graded events. A working party incorporating graded events event-organisers should be established to work on a proposal.

Vote: 18 in favour, 1 abstention

14. ISAF YOUTH SAILING WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP SUBCOMMITTEE

(a) Progress report by the Chairman of the Subcommittee

Page 11 of 14 Last updated: 20-Dec-04

The Subcommittee Chairman reported about the very successful ISAF Youth Sailing Championships held this year in Gdynia, Poland. 52 nations participated and the Championship was very well run. Volvo was again the title sponsor and boats were supplied by Performance Sailcraft Europe, Nautivela, and Hobie Cat Europe. The Hobie 16 with Spinnaker was well received by the participants although there were some 'teething' problems with the equipment. The World Youth Sailing Trust once more supported the 'coach at large' programme run by Jim Saltonstall.

2005 Championship

The Subcommittee decided that the equipment for the boards should remain the Mistral One Design for the 2005 Championship in line with the Regulations. A change to the regulations may be proposed for November in reaction to a possible change in the board equipment for the 2008 Olympic Games.

2006 Championship

The chairman of the Subcommittee informed the Committee that the Organisers of the 2005 expressed the wish to bring the Championship dates forward by one day. The Events Committee agreed.

Vote: Unanimous

The Event Organisers also requested to add a demonstration event to the 2005 Championship using the 29er as 'open' class. The Events Committee regarded this as being not in line with the Regulation and to add undesirable cost to the MNA's participating.

Vote: 16 in favour of rejecting, 1 against, 4 abstentions

2007 ISAF Youth Sailing World Championship

The Subcommittee proposes to accept the bid from San Diego and put this forward as a recommendation to Council.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends that the 2007 ISAF Youth Sailing World Championship shall be awarded to the San Diego Yacht Club, San Diego – California, USA, subject to contract and the approval of the Executive Committee.

Vote: Unanimous

(b) <u>Deferred submission 062-02</u>

The Committee reconsidered submission 062-02 from the Chairman of the Youth and Development Committee about the age level Championships and received a recommendation from the Subcommittee.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council, in line with earlier Events Committee decisions, rejecting submission 062-02 from the Chairman of the Youth and Development Committee about age level Championships.

Vote: 17 in favour of rejecting, 2 against

The Committee considered submission 062-04 from the Icelandic Sailing Association about the equipment for the ISAF Youth Sailing World Championship and received a recommendation from the Subcommittee.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 062-04 from the Icelandic Sailing Association about the equipment for the ISAF Youth Sailing World Championship.

Vote: 17 in favour of rejecting, 2 against, 0 abstentions

(d) Submission 061-04

The Committee considered submission 061-04 from the International 420 Class about the dates for the ISAF Youth Sailing World Championship and received a recommendation from the Subcommittee.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council rejecting submission 061-04 from the International 420 Class about the dates for the ISAF Youth Sailing World Championship.

Vote: 17 in favour of rejecting, 0 against, 2 abstentions

(e) Deferred submission 054-03

The Committee reconsidered submission 054-03 from the Executive Committee about a minimum age limit for the ISAF Youth Sailing World Championship and received a recommendation from the Subcommittee.

Recommendation to Council

The Events Committee recommends to Council, in line with earlier Events Committee decisions, rejecting submission 054-03 from the Executive Committee about a minimum age limit for the ISAF Youth Sailing World Championship.

Vote: 18 in favour of rejecting, 0 against, 1 abstention

15. TEAM RACING SUBCOMMITTEE

The Committee received an update report from the Chairman of the Subcommittee. The Chairman reported that there had been two excellent bids for the 2007 ISAF Team Racing World Championship and that the Committee had voted for the bid from India.

The President informed the Events Committee that the Executive Committee always must have a serious look at the bids before they are finally are approved.

Recommendation to Council:

The Events Committee recommends that the 2007 ISAF Team Racing World Championship shall be awarded to Mumbai – India, subject to contract and the approval of the Executive Committee.

Vote: Unanimous

16. ANNUAL REPORT

The Committee noted that a report from the Committee Chairman covering the period 1 January 2004 to 31 December 2004 must be submitted before 21 January 2005.

17. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- The Chairman thanked all the Committee members for their contribution in the last four years.
- Vice Chairman Sadi Claeys thanked the Chairman for his excellent leadership of the Committee and especially complimented him and the Committee for how efficient the issue of the selection of equipment for the Olympic Games was dealt with.
