PROPOSAL:

That 'windsurfing men' and 'windsurfing women' will be two events included in the 2008 Olympic Sailing Regatta.

CURRENT POSITION:

[None]

REASON:

- 1. Windsurfing is a global egalitarian sport practiced by many men and women
- The characteristics of windsurfing are sufficiently different from the other sailing events to justify two separate events
- Windsurfing stays one of the most popular events in the Olympic Regatta thanks to its affordability; suitability for younger athletes; ability to allow all races to compete at high level, and ability to compete in a wide range of conditions
- 4. Inclusion will allow poorer countries access to the Olympic Regatta; to compete at high level with a real chance of winning a medal; and to develop sailing locally and regionally by building local fleets (being two of the few events that are affordable and suitable for local and regional development)
- 5. The women's windsurfing event has exceeded the International Olympic Committee (IOC) criteria for women's participation for the past three Olympiads.
