Conduct of WS Members – Regulation 35.2

A submission from the Board

Purpose or Objective

To clarify and enhance the conduct obligations of WS members.

Proposal

Amend Regulation 35.2 as follows:

- 35.2.1 In this Code, a "Participant" means
 - (a) any competitor, boat owner, and support person; and
 - (b) any World Sailing Council, committee or commission member, working party member (including any alternates appointed), World Sailing Member (including any representatives sent by a Member to attend World Sailing Events, meetings, or other official functions), World Sailing Officer, World Sailing Race Official, ex-World Sailing Representative or any person, official or body subject to the World Sailing Constitution or World Sailing Regulations.
- 35.2.2 In this Code "Misconduct" means a breach of Regulation 35.2.3, 35.2.4 and/or Regulation 35.3.9.
- 35.2.3 Ne-Participants shall **not** commit misconduct, as defined under RRS 69.1(a).
- 35.2.4 Participants defined by Regulation 35.2.1(b) shall:
 - (a) not commit a breach of the World Sailing Constitution or Regulations that is deliberate, repeated or otherwise more than a misjudgement;
 - (b) act with the utmost integrity, honesty and responsibility;
 - (c) act in good faith towards each other with mutual trust and understanding in all their dealings;
 - (d) treat others with respect;
 - (e) not do anything which compromises, or is likely to compromise, the impartiality of those who work for World Sailing; and
 - (f) not disclose confidential information without the consent of a person authorised to give it or unless required by law to do so.
- 35.2.4 No World Sailing committee or commission member, World Sailing member, World Sailing officer, World Sailing Race Official or World Sailing Representative shall commit a breach of the World Sailing Constitution or Regulations that is deliberate, repeated or otherwise more than a misjudgement.
