## F.1.7 Rigging Types

A submission from the Chairman of the Equipment Committee

#### Purpose or Objective

To clarify when types of standing rigging may be detached.

#### Proposal

### F.1.7 Rigging Types

(a) STANDING RIGGING

**Rigging** used to support a mast **spar** or **hull spar**. It may be adjustable but is not detached when *racing* except as below:

### **Standing Rigging** types:

(i) SHROUD

**Rigging** used to provide transverse support for a mast **spar** or **hull spar** and which may also provide longitudinal support.

(ii) STAY

**Rigging** mainly used to provide longitudinal support for a mast **spar** or **hull spar** or a **sail** which may be detached while *racing*.

(iii) FORESTAY

**Rigging** used to provide forward support for a mast **spar** and is not detached when racing.

### **Current Position**

As above.

#### Reason

1. Some stays (e.g. inner forestay) may sometimes be detached while racing to make it easier while tacking etc. The previous ERS definition was not suitable for this type of stay.
