Notices of Race (NOR)

1. Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016, the prescriptions of Japan Sailing Federation and the related class rules.
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.

2. Advertising

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3. Eligibility and entry

3.1 An oversea competitor shall be eligible for rule 75.2.

A Japanese competitor shall be;

- (a) a JSAF member of 2014, and
- (b) a registered member of each class, and
- (c) either of
 - a highly ranked competitor in the 2013 All Japan Championship of each class, or
 - a self-recommended competitor
- (d) a U-19 competitor shall have approved by a person in parental authority.
- 3.2 A boat that has above eligibility may entry following procedures. Access to the Web page of URL (http://eow2014.jimdo.com/) and submit the application online.



4. Fee

- 4.1 Required fee is as follows:
- For Non-Japanese competitors: Every entry fee is free.

The condition of discount for student's entries to 470 class;

- a) Both skipper and crew shall be students (not valid for one of them is a member of society).
- b) The occupations of both skipper and crew written in the application shall be students.

Entry fees include welcome party fees.

4.2 [Closing date of entry] June 10th (Tuesday), 2014

[Closing time of transferring the entry fee] June 11th (Wednesday), 2014 at 14:30 4,000JPY shall be added if the entry date is later than the closing date of entry. It also applies to whose transferring time is later than the closing time of transferring entry fee even if entry is in time for the closing date of entry.

A competitor is required to write its sail number with the Remitter's Name.

5.3 Number of races

The number of races to be sailed will be as follows. No more than 4 races per day will be sailed, however the number of races each day is at the discretion of the race committee.

6. Measurement

- 6.1 The valid measurement certificate for each boat shall be shown at registration.
- 6.2 The sails shall be measured by official measurer before the race under each class rule.
- 6.3 The procedures of measurement and so on will be displayed at registration.

7. Sailing Instructions

The Sailing Instructions will be available at the WEB site of Enoshima Olympic Week about one week before the regatta.

8. Racing areas

- 8.1 The location of the regatta harbor is shown in the attached drawing A.
- 8.2 The areas to be sailed are shown in the attached drawing B. The races will be sailed in 3 racing areas: A, B1 and C, vicinity of Enoshima Yacht Harbor.

Racing areas may be changed due to the weather conditions.

9. The courses

The courses to be sailed will be a windward-leeward, a triangle-windward-leeward or a trapezoid one. The details will be stated in the Sailing Instructions.

10. Penalty system

- 10.1 Appendix P will apply for the boats break rule 42.
- 10.2 Decisions of the protest committee and international jury will be final as provided in rule 70.5.

11. Scoring system

- 11.1 3 races are required to be completed to constitute a series of 470 class.
 - 2 races are required to be completed to constitute a series of 49er, Laser, Laser radial and Laser 4.7 class.
- 11.2 (a) When fewer than **5** races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When from 5 to 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - (c) When **8** or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

12. Support boats

A supporting boat will be accepted as a rescue one when she satisfies with following conditions:

- a) A supporting boat shall keep the prescribed area during supporting, and is required to participate in rescuing any boats while required by the race committee. She may enter the limited racing area while required.
- b) Each supporting boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.

13. Radio communicatio n

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

14. Prizes

The prizes will be awarded according to the number of entries for each class.

15. Liability

The competitors shall participate in the Olympic Week entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing committee, the race committee, any party, person involved in this organization will accept no liability whatsoever for any personal or material damage, including but not limited to death, injury, consequential damages, sustained prior to, during or after the regatta.

16. Insurance

Each participating boat should be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of one hundred million yen per event or equivalent. See http://www.jsaf.or.jp/hoken/

Diagram A – Harbor location




Diagram B - Racing areas
