NOTICE OF RACE

The following abbreviations apply:

[NP] denotes that a breach of this rule will not be grounds for a protest by a boat.

[DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the International Jury and may be less than disqualification.

[SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee without a hearing.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 No national authority prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3 RRS Appendix T, Arbitration, may apply.
- 1.4 RRS Appendix P, special procedures for Rule 42, will apply.
- 1.5 The following rules, procedures and systems will apply:
 - 1.5.1 World Sailing Functional Classification System and Procedures 2013-2016
 - 1.5.2 For the Two-Person Keelboat Event (SKUD 18): 2017 Class Rule J5
 - 1.5.3 2.4mR-class only: The 2.4 Norlin OD Class Rules
 - 1.5.4 Hansa-class only: Hansa 303 Class Rules
 - 1.5.5 Weta-class only: Weta Class Rules
- 1.6 World Sailing Equipment Inspection Regulations and Support Boat Regulations will apply.
- 1.7 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2. [DP] ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising and bow numbers chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority.
- 2.2 If bibs are provided by the Organizing Authority, while racing, competitors aboard the boats ranked first, second and third in the series at the beginning of that day, shall wear yellow, blue and red bibs respectively.

3. [NP] [DP] ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to boats competing in events chosen for the 2017 PWS Worlds as stated in NoR 5.1.
- 3.2 All athletes must comply with the terms of the current World Sailing Classification System.
- 3.3 Any competitor shall be a national of the country of the Member National Authority which is entering him or her or which he or she represents.
- 3.4 Eligible boats shall enter by completing the online entry form on the event website www.kieler-woche.com and paying the required fees.
- 3.5 Competitors under 18 years of age shall present a signed and completed parent (guardian) consent and declaration form at registration. The forms can be downloaded from the event website: www.kieler-woche.com
- 3.6 World Sailing eligibility shall apply. Each athlete shall be registered as a World Sailing sailor on the World Sailing website: www.sailing.org/sailors.
- 3.7 The minimum number of entries for each class/ event is as stated in NoR 5.1. If the number of entries does not reach the minimum number of entries in the relevant class/event until 01 June 2017, the class/event may be cancelled by the Organizing Authority.

4. WORLD SAILING FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION

- 4.1 Disabled sailors shall have valid International Classification under the current World Sailing Functional Classification System.
- 4.2 Minimal disability criteria apply to all boats.
- 4.3 Protests regarding classification may be filed not later than "first appearance."

5. FEES

- 5.1 Required fees are as follows:

- 5.2 The Entry Fee is non-refundable, with the exception of the regatta or class/event being cancelled by the Organizing Authority.

6. FORMAT

The regatta will consist of a single series.

7. SCHEDULE

7.1 Registration for competitors, coaches and team leaders is scheduled as follows:

7.2 The Opening Ceremony is scheduled to begin at 1900 hrs. on Tuesday, 20 June.

7.3 On the first day of racing a first skippers meeting will be held at 1000 hrs. Details will be published in the Sailing Instructions.

7.4 [NP] The schedule of races and dates of racing is as follows:

7.5 On the last day of racing, no warning signal will be made after 1400 hrs.

8. [NP] [DP] MEASUREMENTS

8.1 Boats may be subject to inspection, including measurement requirements at any time during the event. The procedures for inspections will be specified in the sailing instructions or equipment inspection regulations (EIR).

8.2 The equipment limitations as specified in the class rules shall apply.

8.3 In addition all boats will be measured for compliance with the Class Rules.

9. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available at Check-In.

10. VENUE

10.1 The Events will be hosted at the Kiel-Schilksee Olympic Sailing Center.

10.2 The Race Office will be at the Schilksee Olympic Sailing Center, Kiel-Schilksee. Addendum “Driving Map” shows the location of the regatta harbor (see page 10).

10.3 The racing area will be Kiel Bay, Kiel-Schilksee, Germany. Addendum “Racing Areas” shows the location of the course areas (see page 11).

11. COURSES

The courses will be defined in the Sailing Instructions.

12. PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.1 and RRS Appendix P2.1 will be changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

13. INTERNATIONAL JURY

An International Jury will be appointed in accordance with RRS 91(b). Decisions will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

14. SCORING

- 14.1 A total of at least 5 races are required to be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 14.2 When fewer than 3 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When 3 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

15. [NP] [DP] SUPPORT BOATS

- 15.1 All support boats shall be registered with the Organizing Authority and will be required to comply with local legislation and event support boat regulations. The Organizing Authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at their sole discretion.
- 15.2 Registration fees according to NoR 5.1.
- 15.3 All support boats shall clearly display the three letter national code of their World Sailing Member National Authority at all times while afloat. The minimum height for the letters shall be 200mm and visible from both sides of the boat.

16. [DP] BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while they are in the boat park or harbour.

17. [DP] HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Keelboats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of written permission by the Race Committee.

18. [DP] DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around keelboats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

19. [DP] RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

20. PRIZES

- 20.1 Medals will be awarded to the top 3 boats of each Paralympic event.
- 20.2 Every participating boat may pick up a Kieler-Woche-Plaque as a souvenir at registration.
- 20.3 Prizes not claimed at the prize-giving-ceremony will remain with the Organizing Authority.
- 20.4 Competitors shall return perpetual trophies to the Organizing Authority by 31 December 2017.

21. [DP] MEDIA RIGHTS, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

- 21.1 By participating in an event of the Kieler Woche competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority, their sponsors and the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
- 21.2 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment and positioning equipment as specified and supplied by the Organizing Authority.
- 21.3 The top three competitors as well as the individual race winners may be required to attend a media press conference each day.
- 21.4 Competitors may be required to be available for interviews at the regatta.

22. PRIVACY POLICY

As per 1 January 2015. The organizers, led by Kieler Yacht-Club e.V., Kiellinie 70, 24103 Kiel, Germany, herewith would like to explain to you, what personal information we collect about you with your entry and participation in the race events.

All data regarding participating athletes and their boats will be utilized and archived by us for the purpose of the sporting event. Personal information contains the participant's real name, date of birth, home club, boat type and boat number. In particular, results, calculatory and visual analyses, position monitoring and race analyses will be published with reference to the competitors' names.

In order to achieve this, your data will be transferred to our service providers such as SAP AG, Trac Trac ApS, ST-Sportservice GmbH, addix software GmbH and to such governing bodies like World Sailing, EUROSAF and DSV. It cannot be ruled out, that your data will be processed outside of the EU. Our service providers and governing bodies have been or will be committed by us, to exclusively use your data for the event and its preparation and post-processing, including ranking lists and global multi event scorecards. A commercial use of your data is prohibited.

The use of your data is governed by German law, particularly by the German Data Protection Act (Datenschutzgesetz) and the German Telemedia Act (Telemediengesetz).

23. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY COGNOVITS CLAUSE

- 23.1 The responsibility for the decision to participate in a race or to continue with it is solely with the skipper; to that extent the skipper also accepts full responsibility for the crew. The skipper is responsible for the qualification and the correct nautical conduct of the crew as well as for the

suitability and the transport-safe-condition of the registered boat. In cases of force majeure or on grounds of administrative orders or for safety reasons, the organizer is entitled to make changes in the realization of the event or to cancel the event. This does not constitute any liability by the organizer towards the participant, if the reasons for the changes or the cancellation do not result from a willful or grossly negligent behavior of the organizer. In case of a violation of obligations that do not constitute primary or material contractual duties (cardinal obligations), the liability of the organizer for financial and property damages incurred by the participant during or in connection with the participation in the event and resulting from a conduct of the organizer, its representatives, servants or agents, is restricted to damages that were caused willfully or grossly negligent. When a violation of cardinal obligations occurs due to minor negligence, the liability of the organizer is limited to foreseeable, typical damages. To the extent that the liability for damages of the organizer is excluded or restricted, the participant also relieves the staff – employees and representatives, agents, servants, sponsors and individuals who provide or drive salvage, safety or rescue vessels or assist with their use from the individual liability for damages, as well as also all other individuals who were instructed to act in connection with the realization of the event. The effective racing rules of World Sailing, the administrative regulations regatta-sailing and the articles of association of DSV, the class rules as well as the regulations of the invitation to the competition and the sailing instructions are to be complied with and are expressly recognized.

23.2 The German law shall prevail.

24. [DP] INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid and for the racing area suitable third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 3,000,000 € per incident or the equivalent.

Additional Information (not part of the Notice of Race)

I FURTHER INFORMATION

- I.1 Class and private parties during the event in the harbour require have the permission of the Organizing Authority. Applications shall be made prior to the event.
- I.2 Traffic regulations:
During the Kieler Woche altered traffic regulations will apply in the Kiel-Schilksee Olympic Centre area. All participants are urgently requested to observe the traffic signs when approaching Kiel-Schilksee and to cooperate with the police and the Organizing Authority. Further instructions will be given at the entrance to the harbour area.
- I.2.1 The harbour area is closed for all vehicles at night.
Opening hours:

Friday, 16 June,	0800 – 2400 hrs.
Saturday, 17 June,	0600 – 1200 hrs.
Tuesday, 20 June,	1200 – 2400 hrs.
Wednesday, 21 June,	0600 – 2400 hrs
Thursday, 22 June,	0600 – 1200 hrs.
Sunday, 25 June,	1200 – 2000 hrs.
- I.2.2 Temporary access to the harbour: You may enter temporarily the marina by paying a deposit of 50 € valid for one (1) hour. The deposit will be returned at the exit after having left the harbour area on time.
- I.2.3 Parking: Sufficient parking lots for cars are available near the Kiel-Schilksee Olympic Sailing Centre. Please follow the road signs to the public parking areas. Parking alongside Fördestraße is forbidden and cars will be towed away.
- I.3 It is not permitted to leave cars or boat trailers in the harbour area.
- I.4 Cranes: Keelboats arriving by trailer may be launched and hauled out with their own crane gear by the cranes in the Kiel-Schilksee Olympic Centre only. During the event a craning fee for one launching and one haul-out is covered with the Entry Fee.
- I.4.1 Crane operating hours:

Friday, 16 June,	0800 – 2030 hrs.
Saturday, 17 June,	0700 – 1900 hrs.
Tuesday, 20 June,	0800 – 2030 hrs.
Wednesday, 21 June,	0700 – 2030 hrs
Thursday, 22 June,	0700 – 1900 hrs
Sunday, 25 June,	0800 – 1900 hrs.
- I.5 Boats may also stay or be craned in the harbour of Strande. Arising fees have to be paid by the owners and will not be refunded by the Organizing Authority.
- I.6 The Organizing Authority draws attention to the fact that the responsible drivers of rubber- or other motorboats have to have the German "Sportbootführerschein See" or an equivalent powerboat license of his home country (e.g. RYA level 2 powerboat or international certificate of compliance).
- I.7 The legal speed limit in Strande Bay is 10 knots.
- I.8 Hansa Class charter boats: Charter will be "free" (payed by World Sailing) only for emerging/new nations or other particular cases.
- I.9 2.4 Norlin OD charter boats: Charter will be "free" (payed by World Sailing) only for emerging/new nations or other particular cases.

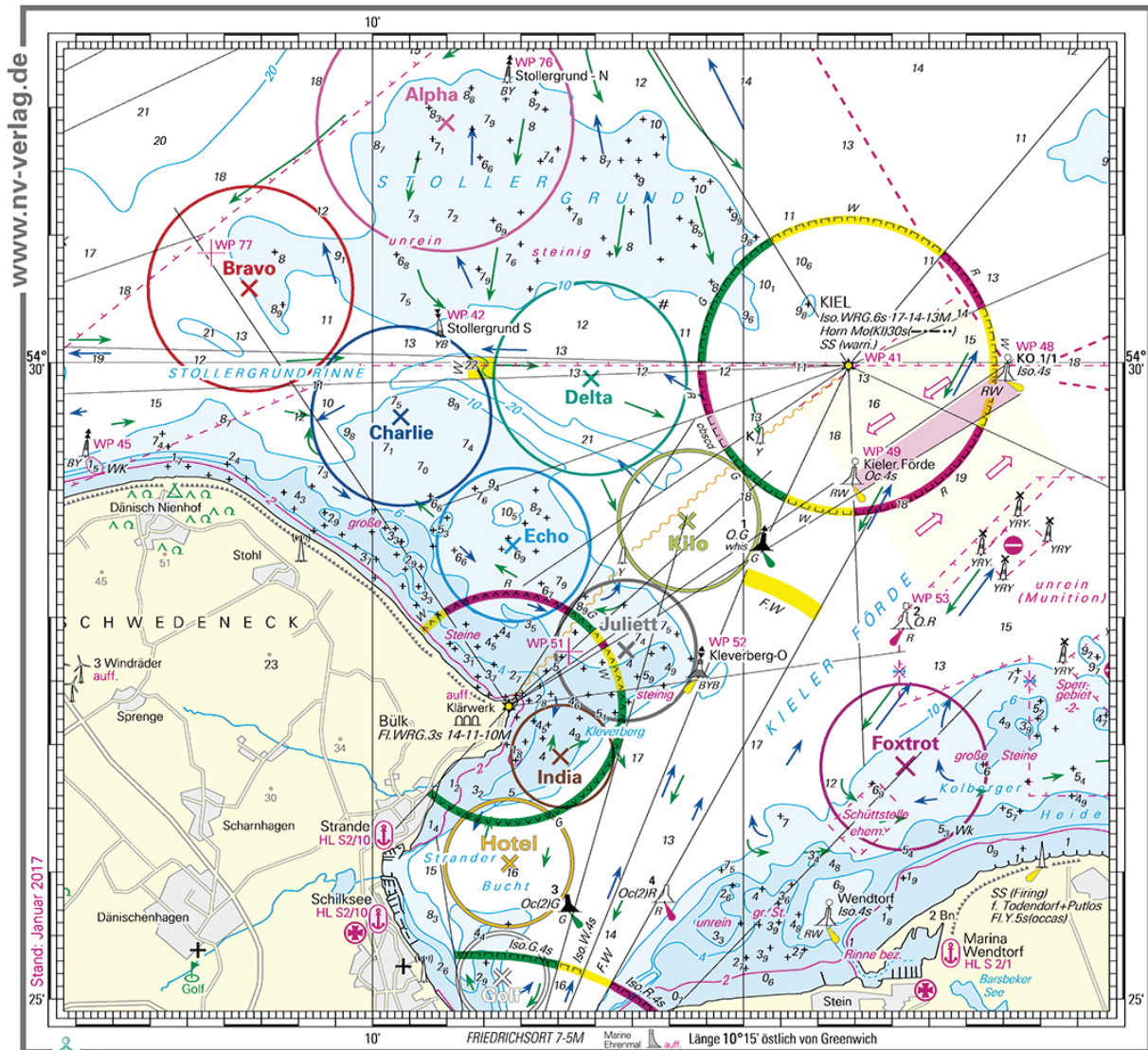
