Session 9 SAR organisation and methods

- 9.1 with regard to the SAR authorities <u>teach the method</u> in the <u>given country</u> areas sailed, <u>(and outline that other methods are possible but await instructions from rescue craft)</u> knowing:
- .2 their landline number to advise them of passage planning if appropriate
- .3 how to call them in emergency
- .4 what facilities they have (and don't have)
- .5 if helicopters are in use, know the sea-rescue system (hi-line, basket pick-up, winchman bridle, etc.) and whether a pick-up from a deck, in the water, or in a liferaft is preferred
- .6 know what radio frequency to expect to use for direct contact
- .7 know what fixed-wing aircraft may be deployed
- .8 understand fixed-wing search patterns, signal flares
- .9 have a knowledge of global SAR organisation
- .10 how to cope with rescue attempts from passing ships
- .11 knowledge of new IAMSAR for small craft
