Requirements to Maintain World Sailing Class Designation

Purpose or Objective

Proposal

Amend Regulation 10.5(f)(iii) as follows:

have at least one World Sailing recognized class International Measurer (see Regulation 31.1(d)). This Regulation 10.5(f)(iii) applies

- (a) For new World Sailing Classes, 24 months after designation as World Sailing Class Association
- (b) For existing World Sailing Classes, not before 31 December 2022. Regulation 10.5.(f)(iii)(b) ceases on 1 January 2023;

Current Position

As above

Reasons

- 1. The requirement to have an International Class Measurer was added during the 2019 Annual Conference
- 2. There have been virtually no international events in 2020.
- 3. To be appointed IM for a class, an applicant must attend a minimum of 2 major class events.
- 4. For new classes and existing classes without a class IM, it is not possible to comply without interim period. If a class is holding one World Championship per year, it takes a minimum of 2 years for an IM applicant to be appointed as IM for that class.
- 5. The timelines set out above take into account that the current pandemic might continue into 2021 and may require further adjustments in the future.
